# What a year!

We surpassed our 400-member membership goal in the early months with new social media outreach, newly pioneered online signup and web presence, beautifully re-designed newsletters, great trainings, parties, and events!

We trained 44 new sailors in Basic Sailing, 15 new Cruising sailors, 10 new Spinnaker sailors, and 25 new sailors who can capsize a boat for you. Well, and even bring a vessel up from a capsize! Our boats competed admirably in races on the river, with great sportsmanship, and many first and second place trophies. We audited our systems,

and ensured our financial health with smart oversight and thoughtfulness in contracts. We did a fantastic job assisting sailing in the Special Olympics and we raised more funds than any of our sister clubs in the area to fight blood cancer in the well-attended Leukemia Cup Regatta.

We racked up 96 Flying Scot Skippers, 23 Cruiser Skippers, and 45 skippers of both. We added Red Cross certification in First Aid, CPR, and Automatic External Defibrillation (AED) to improve the skills of our instructors, Directors and members. We worked with the Coast Guard Auxillary and conducted Vessel Safety Checks to each of the vessels in our Flying Scot fleet. We added safety gear from the Harbor Patrol and new safety bags for every Flying Scot with charts, radios, first aid and more. And we were able to help the National Park Service by participating in river and park

cleanups and by encouraging the repainting and revitalizing of our marina's facilities.

We sold our beloved 1983 Catalina 25', Topaz. Bought and delivered a new 2003 Catalina 250, Hiatus. Improved our slips. And have purchased our 5th Flying Scot that we just delivered to our marina a few days ago. And now we're ready to turn the calendar and welcome our new and able board for 2013.

2012 has passed quickly, but it has been a wonderful year! Thank you for all that you do to make the club a joy.


# **Sunday Flying Scot Racing** was a **Popular Event in 2012**



#### Maintenance Day (continued)

Here's what we accomplished with the Flying Scots:

- Installed/replaced backlash spring and brakes on winch assembly on all four Flying Scots.
- 2. Lubricated the winch assembly on all four Flying Scots.
- 3. Repaired the halyard winch assembly on Ms. Ellie by adding a missing bolt, repair led by Jim Klein.
- 4. Investigated and fixed the friction in the mainsheet on Suzie Q by replacing a t-strap, repair led by Alice Starcke.

Due to the temperature and not quite enough volunteers available to turn the boat, over these tasks are still outstanding:

- 1. Replacing Ms. Ellie's centerboard gasket.
- 2. Installing/replacing cove stripes; Suzie Q is not eligible because of her painted surface.
- 3. Wash/dry and "Starbrite".

It's official! Our newest cruiser is now available to enjoy, thanks to some very dedicated volunteers. Cruiser skippers who have competed the mandatory familiarization are free to reserve her on Faces, our online reservation system.

Our entire fleet is in great shape this year, due to the great work by our volunteers and Directors. Remember to do your part and be sure to stow all gear in their proper places, and wash down the boat after you have enjoyed your sail.


# Newest Flying Scot Delivered to WSM

Volunteers came out on Saturday, December 15 to get her ready for our club. Here's what was done:

- Installed a new lifting bridle
- Installed a new windex
- Installed a new hull plug and cable
- Moved her sails from the existing square bags to new tube bags
- Raised the mast and attached the boom
- Installed the rudder continued.

She has all the SCOW safety equipment onboard. Her safety bag is also complete and ready to go.



Runneth Over took home 8 First In Series award plates. Other SCOW winners were skippers Chris McGraw, Kyoko Kawai and Mike Rothenberg.


