A letter dated January 11, 2014 from Laura, Ben Ackerman's daughter:

I am writing again to let you know that my father, Ben Ackerman, passed away peacefully at The Oaks of Brevard (NC) in the early hours this morning. His heart was full with happy memories, and he was ready to cast off and drift with the tides. We had had heavy rain throughout the night, and just a few minutes after dad passed there was about 10 minutes of loud thunder and bright lightening. How often is there a thunderstorm in the middle of a winter night? I couldn't help but feel that Ben and Jeanne were letting me know that all is well. It will be a week or two before I know the date for dad's memorial service at Arlington Cemetery, and I will certainly share the information as soon as I have it.

I've attached one of my favorite photos of dad, taken during his cruise aboard the Star Clipper last March. I'm also attaching the poem "If" by Rudyard Kipling, which was very meaningful to dad throughout his life. The story behind it follows below.

Few of you may know that Ben's father passed away unexpectedly when my dad was only 8 years old. Difficult times followed, but a few years later a junior high shop teacher took Ben under his wing. It happens that the teacher was a Sea Scout leader for a troop that sailed at the nearby New Jersey shore. Ben joined the troop, igniting his lifelong passion for sailing and also



inspiring him to join ROTC and eventually become a naval officer; along the way he met and married Jeanne. When dad graduated from junior high, the teacher gave him a framed copy of the Kipling poem inscribed, "And I know you will!" Dad kept that poem for more than 70 years and just a few weeks ago he asked me to pass it on to his oldest grandson. I knew then that he was wrapping up his earthly affairs. What I love about this story, in addition to the message of the poem itself, is the proof that extending a helping hand to someone can have an impact that reverberates far beyond what anyone might imagine. If all of us who have been touched by Ben's spirit of friendliness and generosity carry it forward in our own lives, that will be a tribute worthy of the man.
