Small craft advisory and PFD wearing policies. As long as I've been on the board we've sought to address the policy of small craft advisories. This year, for the third time in as many years we took a look at the policy. With the combined efforts of John Rogers and the remainder of the Training and Skipper Certification Committee, having conducted a survey of your thoughts, information collected by the board from other local organizations and reviewing our insurance policy I regretfully report that we decided to leave the policy as is, namely no sailing in the Flying Scots during Small Craft Advisories and not allowing sailing in the cruiser in forecasted winds of 25 knots or more. On the PFD wearing policy we've decided to require the PFDs be worn during the period from October 1 to May 1.

Financially the club is having a great year. With the combination of the dues and fees increase, your participation in the fleet maintenance and your diligence in operating our fleet we're having a great year. We have over 400 members and things are going well. The 2010 contribution to the Boat Asset Fund was made early and well in excess of the minimum required in anticipation of updating part of our fleet in the coming year.

Speaking on behalf of the entire 2010 board, we hope that you are having a fulfilling membership experience and we look forward to your continued efforts in the future.

I like to close with a reminder of the mission of this club, so that we do not lose sight of it:

"...provide its membership with opportunities to sail, to exchange information about sailing, to learn safe boating procedures, and to meet others in the Potomac River/Chesapeake Bay area with similar interests. The Club shall plan activities for both the novice and experienced sailor."

# On the River: SCOW Friday Night Raft-Ups

Seven cruisers and more than 30 SCOW members and their guests participated in the club's Friday, May 21 moonlight raft-up. Additional moonlight raft-ups were held on June 25 and July 23 with roughly the same number of boats and SCOW members participating.

All the raft-ups were great fun. Good food, good sailing, lots of grog and great crew! For all three raft-ups, we left the dock roughly at 7 p.m., sailed for a couple of hours, and then rafted up between the #2 and #4 marks outside of Old Town. The raft-up in May was closer to the #2 mark. The bridge looked great all lit up with beautiful reflections on the river and a nice through-the-bridge view of National Harbor. The June and July raft-ups were closer to the #4 mark and provided an equally nice view of the bridge and Old Town. *(continued on next page)*

There have been a total of six SCOW monthly Friday evening raft-ups this sailing season. Future Moonlight Raft-Ups are scheduled for September 24, and October 22. ALL SCOW emails are sent out approximately two weeks before the raft-up looking for crew and skippers to sign-up. Those who have not participated in a previous raft-up get priority.

## October 23-24 – Fowl Weather Raft-Up

SCOW will once again hold its annual Fowl Weather Raft-Up on the weekend of October 23 & 24. We will meet on Saturday in Granary Creek, off the Wye East River and adjacent to the Wye Island Natural Resource Area. (Dividing Creek, just down the river, will be our back-up if Granary Creek is full.) For those who would like to explore Wye Island, you can dinghy ashore from Granary Creek. This area is a great place to watch the migrating geese and enjoy the fall colors, and is one of the best gunkholes on the bay.

I'd appreciate it if those skippers planning to attend would touch base beforehand so we have some idea of how many boats to expect. Also, for those who would like to crew, let me know and I will make your names available to those skippers who might be looking for crew.

Just so you know, this weekend coincides with the Cambridge Schooner Rendezvous, and some may wish to attend that event. However, for many of us in the northern part of the bay, Cambridge is a bit too far away for a weekend sail late in the season, with its shorter days and stiff northerly winds on the return trip. I've discussed this with Lisa Carr, the bay coordinator, and we believe that there shouldn't be much of a conflict for most sailors.
