It has been a big year, with SCOW skip-pers taking their boats on the road to regattas around the region and SCOW sailors playing a huge role in the resurgence of Flying Scot one design racing on the Potomac.

J-22 Racing in Baltimore at the DSC Ya'Gotta Regatta

Through a veteran led volunteer sailing program call US Patriot Sailing, I became involved in racing J-22s up in Baltimore's Inner Harbor through another great program called the Downtown Sailing Center (DSC). Through US Patriot Sailing, I was able to skipper an all veteran crew on a J-22 in the annual fundraising DSC Ya' Gotta Regatta. It was a very competitive fleet of eleven boats. We finished 10th out of 11 and weren't really disappointed. We sailed well and had a great time. Just like with the Flying Scot, there are some sail trim and balance secrets that I need to figure out to be competitive. We had great starts, stayed out of trouble, but somehow ended up rounding the windward mark at or near the bottom most of the time. 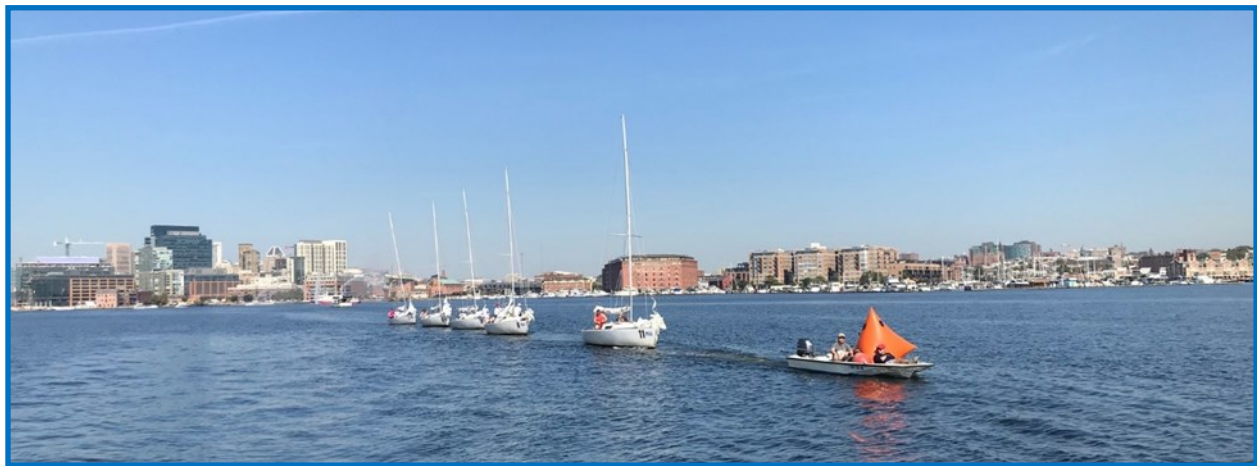
