FOLLOWING THE "BEST DAY SAIL" HE EVER HAD, FIND OUT HOW JOE GOT HIS HANDS ON THE COVETED FLYING SCOT PRESIDENT'S CUP TROPHY!

The forecast on Sept 7 was only 5-6 mph from Nonetheless. I set sail with Robert NE. Gregorits (SCOW skipper), his son and Esther for Turkey Point. After rounding the point we enjoyed the breeze with Robert at the tiller for 20 minutes. But. I became anxious as the breeze eased, then died. We were in the worst spot--the strongest ebb tide was around the point. Would this be the first time I have to call Boat US for a tow at a cost of at least \$100? And. Esther had to leave the sailing center at about 5:30 for a later commitment. I promised to get her back, but even with a tow we would not make that time. We were in luck since another Scot with a 2 hp outboard motor was about 150 feet from us; no other powered sailboat around. We got back at 5:32!

Had time to discuss the SCOW organization, especially training new skippers, with Dave Neff. I encouraged him to hold another two day race. He mentioned he possessed the President's Cup for 31 years, since FS racing ended in 1988 on the Potomac. Neff was the last winner in 1988. What a discovery! I didn't know there was a cup for the Flying Scot fleet. Yes indeed! It is a beautiful silver, half-cup mounted on a mahogany plaque with engraved names of winners of the President's Cup since 1961. Wow! Names such as the boat designer, Gordon Douglas and FS builder Harry Carpenter. I brought it back-reluctantly giving it to Dave Beckett. He sent an email to all SCOW racers before the President's Cup Regatta which discussed this history. What's next for day sailing this year? A sail to Annapolis-and back, hopefully.
