*** Don't forget the new SCOW requirement, in keeping with the new Washington DC regulation, that all SCOW skippers have a Boating Safety Certificate and carry it with them while operating the boats. You must send a photocopy of the certificate with your skipper

renewal application in order to remain a SCOW skipper. Luckily, it's easy to get the certificate by taking a quick quiz over the internet or taking a safety class through the US Power Squadron or Coast Guard Auxiliary (See the January issue of chaNNels, Page 7 for more info on this -Ed.)

I'll also have the renewal forms at the Re-Up Brunch on March 14th. Bring your checkbook! If you're like me, you can't wait to get on the water. See you dockside!
